PROGRAMMING CHANGES

All proposed programming changes shall be presented to the Program Advisory Committee (PAC) for discussion, as per the Programming Task Breakdown Policy A4. PAC will advise Program Staff on major programming changes.

A. Major programming changes are defined as:

- 1. Changes to or removal of a single program for not following KBOO mission or approved program description
- 2. Changes that affect more than one program.

B. Procedure for A1 above:

- 1. PAC will ask Staff to investigate a program after evaluation has shown it is not following KBOO's mission or the original approved program proposal.
- 2. Staff will meet with the programmer(s) to find out why they are not doing the program as it was approved.
- 3. Staff will report back at the next PAC meeting, inviting the affected programmer(s) to the meeting for problem solving, and a discussion of next steps. Opportunities for public input shall be given at the meeting.
- 4. PAC shall make a recommendation to the Program Staff concerning the proposed change at the committee's next meeting.

After considering the recommendation of PAC, the Program Staff shall decide whether and in what manner to implement the proposed change(s). The board may overturn the decision of the Program Staff if, and only if, it finds that decision to be inconsistent with the KBOO's programming charter and mission, and the criteria for making programming decisions.

Program Change Criteria:

KBOO recognizes that there are numerous communities that need access to radio. In making programming decisions, PAC shall use the criteria below.

KBOO's programming will:

- further the goals and values set forth in the KBOO programming charter and mission statement
- not discriminate on the basis of race, color, creed, national origin, gender, sexual orientation, age, religion, marital or housing status, or physical or mental disability

- encourage positive relationships and increased understanding among different cultures
- provide exposure to innovative and unrecognized cultural, music, and spoken-word programming
- strives for technical as well as overall quality
- not proselytize a religion.
